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TAMIL NADU

Tamil Nadu is the homeland of one of humanity's living classical civilisations, stretching back uninterrupted for two millennia and very much alive today in the Tamils' language, dance, poetry and forms of Hinduism. It is home to impressive temples and churches, great museums and enthusiastic locals.

Some of the temples here are among India's finest, from the sculpted stonework at Thanjavur (Tanjore) to the sprawling halls at Madurai. Across the state, pulsing urban centres rise

like concrete islands amid a landscape of palm and banana plantations, rice fields and rugged sandstone scarps. Among them you'll find renowned yoga and meditation retreats, ancient forts and French-colonial-turned-bohemian B&Bs.

When the hot chaos of Tamil temple towns overwhelms, escape to the southernmost tip of India where three seas mingle; to the splendid mansions sprinkled across arid Chettinadu; or to the cool, forest-clad, wildlife-prowled Western Ghats. It's all packed into a state that remains proudly distinct from the rest of India, while also being among the most welcoming.

KERALA

For many travelers, Kerala is South India's most serenely beautiful state. This slender coastal strip is defined by its layered landscape: almost 600km of glorious Arabian Sea coast and beaches; a languid network of glistening backwaters; and the spiceand tea-covered hills of the Western Ghats, dotted with fiercely protected wildlife reserves and cool hill stations such as Munnar. Just setting foot on this swathe of soul-soothing, palm-shaded green will slow your subcontinental stride to a blissedout amble. Kerala is a world away from the frenzy of the rest of India, its long, fascinating backstory illuminated by historically evocative cities like Kochi (Cochin) and Thiruvananthapuram (Trivandrum).

Besides the famous backwaters, elegant houseboats, ayurvedic treatments and delicately spiced, taste-bud-tingling cuisine, Kerala is home to wild elephants, exotic birds and the odd tiger, while vibrant traditions such as Kathakali, theyyam (a trance-induced ritual), temple festivals and snakeboat races frequently bring even the smallest villages to life.

KARNATAKA

A stunning introduction to southern India, Karnataka is a prosperous, compelling state loaded with a winning blend of urban cool, glittering palaces, national parks, ancient ruins, beaches, yoga centres and legendary travellers' hang-outs.

At its nerve centre is the capital, Bengaluru (Bangalore), a progressive cybercity famous for its craft-beer and restaurant scene. Heading out of town you'll encounter the evergreen rolling hills of

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Kodagu, dotted with spice and coffee plantations, the regal splendour of Mysuru (Mysore), and jungles teeming with monkeys, tigers and Asia's biggest population of elephants.

If that all sounds too mainstream, head to the countercultural enclave of tranquil Hampi, with hammocks, psychedelic sunsets and boulderstrewn ruins. Or the blissful, virtually untouched coastline around Gokarna, blessed with beautiful coves and empty sands. Or leave the tourist trail behind entirely and take a journey to the evocative Islamic ruins of northern Karnataka.

ANDHRA PRADESH AND TELANGANA

Hyderabad, one of Islamic India's greatest cities, is reason enough on its own to visit this region. Its skyline is a sight to behold, defined by the great domes and minarets of ancient mosques, mausoleums and palaces of once-mighty dynasties. Delve inside the city's fabled old quarter for fascinating street markets, Sufi shrines, teahouses and biryani restaurants. Meanwhile, Hyderabad's newer districts are awash with

the upmarket restaurants of IT-fuelled economic advancement.

The other attractions of these two states (which were one entity until 2014) are less brazen, but there are hidden gems like the wonderful temple sculptures of Ramappa and ancient Buddhist sites at Sankaram and Guntupalli. Coastal Visakhapatnam has a cheery vibe, while joining the pilgrim crowds on the hike up to Tirumala's temple is an unforgettable experience. Recently upgraded airports (at Tirupati, Vijaywada and Visakhapatnam) and increased regional flights have really opened up these captivating states for travellers.

he film music industry in India can be split into two. One, before the arrival of Rahman and the other, after his arrival. From the quality of music production, technicians and musicians to the sheer range of voices used in his songs, Rahman truly is in a league of his own. With every new music album, he sets the bar to only surpass it and set new ones.

Rahman started his career as a musician working as a keyboard player for many composers. His ticket to limelight was Mani Ratnam's Roja in 1992. A movie that made the entire film industry turn back and take a look at the youngster who would rule Indian film music for a very long time. The film won Rahman the Rajat Kamal award for Best Music Director at the National Film Awards. Since then, Rahman has gone on to win the National Award 3 more times, the most ever by any music composer.

Rahman's discography spans across the Indian film industry with over 170 films in the 5 languages - Hindi, English, Malayalam, Tamil and Telugu. His soundtracks had a freshness that resonated with audiences across the country. He continued to prove himself as a versatile composer with his experiments in Western Classical music, Carnatic and folk music. His music for Slumdog Millionaire in 2008, earned him the Best Original Score and Best Original Song at the 81st Academy Awards. Apart from successful soundtracks, he has also received acclaim for his background scores and is considered one of the finest background-score composers in India

His gallery of awards and unmatchable list of achievements are nothing when compared to his heart of gold and humble nature. His often quoted Oscar acceptance speech where he credited his success to his mother and god is a testimony to his grounded and humble nature. Rahman is also involved with a number of charitable causes; his work towards making music accessible to the underprivileged is particularly commendable. In 2009, he founded Sunshine Orchestra with a vision to introduce India's first symphony orchestra where economically and socially deprived children get free music education by his institute, KM Music Conservatory.

cross India 680 stores in 80 cities with 7500 working professionals is an extraordinary feat for any business. But the founders CK Kumaravel and Veena Kumaravel are not in it just for the business value. The 400 crore worth company has also empowered hundreds of women entrepreneurs and generated more than 9000 direct jobs.

Coming from a business background CK Kumaravel was always inclined towards becoming a job provider and not a job seeker. But it was wife, Veena, who laid the foundation for Naturals. The lack of quality and affordable salons in Chennai pushed them towards starting a salon that would offer standard beauty services at a reasonable price for people from all walks of life. From procurement of equipment & products to interior design and pricing their services, Kumaravel and Veena learnt everything about the beauty industry, the hard way.

The Beauty Industry in India was huge and had a great potential but most of it was still unorganised and there was a dearth for skilled stylists and beauty professionals. It was a time when working in a beauty salon was still considered a taboo. Naturals found a way to tackle this issue. They initially started offering free training for interested individuals and also offered them employment at Naturals. Today this has grown into the Naturals Academy that offers various courses in beauty, hairstyling, makeup and grooming. By the end of 3 years, Naturals managed to reach 7 salons in Tamil Nadu but they both knew that it wasn't the big picture they had dreamt of. They developed a franchisee model that became a pioneer in the country and catapulted their business to the big leagues. Naturals became a platform for so many first-generation entrepreneurs and women entrepreneurs with their hassle free franchisee programme that requires a very minimum advertising and marketing spend. More than 400 women who were earlier homemakers have become successful entrepreneurs and Naturals Franchisees.

Naturals is also gearing up for the post-pandemic world with standard SOPs that prioritise hygiene and safety of the customers. They also recently started offering home services for customers. In the coming years, Naturals hopes to make their brand a household name in the North Indian market too. Through this journey, they also want to empower 1000 women and turn them into successful entrepreneurs.

But companies in India were reluctant to offer a woman a job in brewing. Mazumdar-Shaw returned to Europe and a chance meeting with Leslie Auchincloss, founder of the biotechnology company Biocon Biochemicals, changed her direction completely.

She became the managing director of Biocon India in 1978 and raised that company from its first home (her garage) to become the country's leading biotechnology enterprise In 1994, she started another company- Syngene, a contract research company, which has now a market value of over Rs 22,000 crore. Syngene today works for world's biggest drug companies like Glaxo Smith Kline Beecham, Bristol Myers Squibb and Astra Zeneca on research projects.

In 2001 Biocon became the first Indian company to gain the approval of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for the manufacture of a cholesterol-lowering molecule. The company expanded and profits skyrocketed. Mazumdar-Shaw who had nearly 40-percent stake in the company, became the richest woman in India. Over the years, Biocon has consistently been a trailblazer in the field of pharmaceuticals and even developed the world's first orally consumed insulin product.

Today the company is India's largest producer of Insulin and has pioneered the world's only

Pichia-based recombinant human insulin, which is now available in over 40 countries. Her vision and relentless work in the field of biotechnology has garnered global attention both for the Indian industry and Biocon.

Her vision to achieve affordable healthcare led to philanthropic initiatives such as establishing primary healthcare centers, telemedicine facilities, health awareness programs, sanitation facilities and preventive screening camps for marginalized communities. The Mazumdar- Shaw Medical Center in Bengaluru offers affordable world-class cancer care services to patients from all walks of life.

Mazumdar-Shaw was most recently named the EY World Entrepreneur of the Year 2020. In 2005 she received the Padma Bhushan Award, one of India's highest civilian honours, for her pioneering work in industrial biotechnology. She was also featured in 2010 on the Forbes "100 Most Powerful Women" list and Time magazine's "100 Most Influential People in the World" list.

He has also sung in Arabic, English, Latin and Russian. He once recorded 16 songs in four languages. His first song in Tamil was Neeyum Bommai Naanum Bommai in the film Bommai (1963). In his illustrious career, he has sung for all the stalwarts of South India, worked with legendary music composers and sung alongside generations of male and female singers.

Over the decades, Dr. KJ Yesudas's voice has become an integral part of every music

lover's life. His natural ability to emote through the song and do justice to the lyrics through his clear pronunciation is simply unmatched in the Indian singing fraternity. His songs in various languages are a testimony to his singing prowess and dedication. He has won 8 national awards and been conferred the highest civilian awards in the country such as the Padma Shri, Padma Bhushan and Padma Vibhushan. While inherent talent plays a significant role in his success, his years of classical training and practising his craft has made him one of the greatest singers the country has ever seen.

His amazing work ethic and discipline towards music has continued despite his staggering list of achievements. He still wakes up at 5 AM everyday to practise music. And those early intervention measures have helped Kerala maintain a low mortality rate of 0.35% when compared to the national rate at 1.6% and the global rate at 3 %.

Even as a college student, Shailaja was interested in activism and that led her to join the CPM full time. Her oratory and administrative skills helped Shailaja rise up in the ranks of the party quickly. In 1996, she successfully contested from the Koothuparamba constituency and became Member of Legislative Assembly. Under her tenure as Health Care minister in the Pinarayi Vijayan led government, the state has completely revamped its healthcare facilities and technology from the grassroots level.

Female leaders across the world have demonstrated their administrative prowess during the Global Pandemic and KK Shailaja stands tall among them as someone who leads by example, making way for a generation of women leaders in health care, administration and politics.

oday the name Dindigul Thalappakatti is synonymous with flavourful seeraga samba biriyani; the brand is an identity of the Tamil Nadu food scene. While his grandfather, Mr. Nagasamy Naidu, (The restaurant is named Thalappakatti in memory of his iconic head turban or thalapa) was instrumental in creating the signature seeraga samba biriyani and Dalcha, his grandson Nagasamy Dhanabalan has now become the face of the brand by taking it out of Dindigul and taking Thalappakatti Seeraga Samba biriyani to the world.

Dhanabalan mentions that his stint in the UK helped him realise the potential of their hotel and how it could become a pan-national brand like KFC or McDonalds. So when he came back to India after his studies to manage their hotel, he started drafting a bigger game plan for the brand. The first step was bringing their regional brand to the capital city, Chennai. The city was dominated by biriyani outlets that served Basmati rice biriyani and many discouraged Dhanabalan from setting up shop in Chennai because the people were unfamiliar with the taste of seeraga samba biryani. They also faced issues with hotels that duplicated their brand name but they took every obstacle as a challenge and soon gained a strong foothold in Chennai and eventually Tamil Nadu.

Nagasamy's better half, Deepika Nagasamy has her hands full with directorial responsibilities at Dindigul Thalappakatti, being the creative brain behind Thalappakatti's thriving social media presence and a doting mother of two kids. Under his mentorship, Sindhu touched greater heights and won a host of sub-junior titles. She made her international debut in 2009 at the age of 14. In 2009, PV Sindhu won the bronze medal in the sub-junior Asian Badminton Championships and a year later, she bagged singles silver in the International Badminton Challenge in Iran. PV Sindhu won the Asian Junior Championships in 2012, won silver and gold medals at the Commonwealth games in 2014 and her biggest achievement till date, the silver medal at the Rio Olympics 2016. With that she became the first Indian badminton player to reach a final at the Olympics.

After a few setbacks in her form, she won the world championship much recently in 2019 and has her eyes set on the Tokyo Olympics happening in 2021. She is the recipient of the sports honour Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna, and India's fourth highest civilian award, the Padma Shri. She was also honoured with Padma Bhushan, the third highest civilian award in India, in January 2020.

ahul Sharad Dravid, popularly known as Rahul Dravid or The Wall, is certainly one of the finest batsmen this country has ever produced. Right now he is the overseas batting consultant for the Indian team and the head coach for the Under-19 team, training young players to better their game.

Rahul Dravid's father was a cricket lover who regularly took his sons to watch cricket matches. Soon Dravid started developing a passion for cricket too. Dravid started training professionally and represented the Karnataka team in various tournaments. He made his Ranji debut in 1991. Dravid's nickname comes from his ability to face any kind of ball at the crease. He had a world-class defence and played excellent strokes that were simply a delight to watch. Dravid's most memorable knock came in the 'Final Frontier' test match against Australia at the Eden Gardens. In his ODI career, he amassed a total 10,889 runs in 344 matches at an average of 39.17. It included 12 hundred and 83 fifties. He is the 3rd highest run-getter in ODIs for India.

In 164 tests, he accumulated 13288 runs at an average of 52.31. He scored 36 hundred and 63 fifties in his Test career. He is also the 2nd highest run-getter for India in Tests. He was Vice Captain during the 2003 World cup where India reached the final. Dravid was the captain during the 2007 cricket world cup, when the Indian team exited the tournament in the preliminary games. Teammates and opponents fondly remember his poised, gentleman style game and stylish shots. Off the pitch too, he was a person who ate and breathed only cricket. Rahul was never one to be bothered about brands, clothes, gadgets or any other material goods. But he would instantly notice if his bat was off by a gram. In March 2012, he announced his formal retirement from International and First Class cricket.

Years after his retirement, fans still remember the humble person who touched such highs in the field of cricket but always remained grounded. Post his retirement, Rahul preferred working with young talent and chose to coach the U-19 team so that he could mould them to become better cricketers for the nation. he Indian Premier League, since it's first installment, has helped identify raw cricketing talent across the country like never before. Ravichandran Ashwin or Ash, as he is fondly referred to by his teammates, has truly been one of the greatest finds of the premier league. Chennai-born and raised Ashwin harboured cricket dreams like any average Indian kid but it was his change of direction from batting to spin bowling that landed him a place in the Indian team and went on to make him one of the most celebrated spin bowlers of all time.

Ashwin made his first-class debut for Tamil Nadu in 2006 and even captained the team, but his bowling career picked up only after he was picked up by the Chennai Super Kings team in 2010. His consistent performance in that season landed him a spot in the Indian squad that won the 2011 Cricket World cup even though he made it to the playing eleven only for 2 games. 2011 also marked Ashwin's Test debut against West Indies. He proved his mettle with the ball and bat by taking two five-wicket hauls and scoring. a century. He won the player of the series award for that stellar performance.

Ashwin's test streak continued in 2013 when he was selected for the Border-Gavaskar Trophy. He picked up 29 wickets in the series and became the third Indian bowler to pick up more than 25 wickets in a single series. He was the recipient of the Arjuna Award in 2014.

Over the years. Ashwin has also developed his

signature carrom ball style bowling that bamboozles batsmen because it requires the bowler to hold the ball between his thumb and the index fingers to generate an extra turn. It is very difficult for batsmen to judge the delivery hence makes it one of the most effective wicket-taking balls.

In 2016, he became the only Indian after Rahul Dravid & Sachin Tendulkar to win the ICC Cricketer of the Year award. He also became the ICC Test Cricketer of the year in December, 2016. In 2018, Ashwin was dropped by the Chennai Super Kings team in the auction and went on to captain Kings XI Punjab team. Currently he represented the Delhi Capitals.

In 2016, he became the only Indian after Rahul Dravid & Sachin Tendulkar to win the ICC Cricketer of the Year award.

he word 'Arghyam' literally translates to offering in Sanskrit. It is only fitting that Rohini Nilekani started the organisation with her own personal endowment in 2001. Arghyam is a grant making foundation that takes a data-driven approach to sanitation and water. It has been working with a vision of providing safe, sustainable water for all and has built a presence in 22 states to address the issue of water security for vulnerable communities.

Arghyam has two flagship programs: the India Water Portal (IWP) and the Participatory Groundwater Management program (PGWM). The former serves as a knowledge database for all things pertaining to water. The latter focuses on supporting small communities to manage depleting water resources.

The IWP website provides access to working papers, reports, data, articles, news, events, and discussions on water. A team of 20 people spread across India identify local water stories and solutions for the website. Each person focuses on a particular region of the country, producing stories and doing outreach with local press, journalists, and changemakers.

The PGWM program focused on recharging regional aquifers, geological mapping, testing water quality, and developing usage protocols for drinking and irrigation to improve groundwater levels.

Rohini Nilekani started her charity work almost 2 decades ago by financially supporting young girls. Over the years, her charity and social work has spread across the sectors of education, environment and community development. The Akshara foundation which is also founded by Nilekani, aids government run primary schools and helps education reach everybody.

Her literary works include a medical thriller called 'Stillborn', a non- fiction book called 'Uncommon Ground' and several books for young children including the most popular 'Annual Haircut Day'. All her children's books were published by Pratham Books, a non-profit children's publisher founded by Nilekani herself.

Nilekani's idea about philanthropy is deep rooted in the Indian scenario with solutions to solve our indigenous problems instead of just standing on the sidelines. Her transformation from homemaker to changemaker is something that all young social entrepreneurs can learn from. But with respect to her goals for her philanthropy, she still believes there is a long way to go.

But her journey to the top has not been an easy one.

Saina Nehwal was born in Haryana and began to pursue badminton from a very small age because both her parents were district level badminton champions in Haryana. Soon after they moved to Hyderabad, Nehwal began training professionally. Nehwal's day would start in the wee hours of the morning where she had to travel almost 25kms to reach her training facility.

Nehwal's breakthrough came when she won the junior badminton championship back to back in 2004 and 2005. In 2006, Nehwal won the Asian Satellite Badminton Tournament and became a known name in the badminton circuit. She became the first Indian shuttler to qualify in the quarterfinals of the Olympics in 2008. Her firsts didn't stop there. She was also the first Indian to win an Olympic medal in Badminton at the 2012 London Olympics and the first badminton player to win a super series tournament.

Nehwal is also the only Indian to have won at least one medal in every BWF major - the World Championships, the World Junior Championships - and that most precious bronze medal at the Olympics. She gradually rose in rankings and became the world's number one badminton player in April 2015. She was honoured with the Arjuna award and Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna award for her achievements in the field of badminton.

From harbouring the dream of one day representing the country and barely having the money to travel to matches and tournaments, Saina Nehwal has taken a very disciplined and focussed path towards success. Her sacrifices in personal life and hard work on the court have resulted in medals and victories. The Olympic gold still eludes her but the champion is all set to focus on her game and preparing to qualify for the Tokyo Olympics in 2021.

Sudha Murthy put her doctorate plans on the back burner and decided to take up this issue with JRD Tata himself. She wrote a postcard addressing this injustice towards female candidates. It immediately struck a chord with the stalwart. She was called for an interview in Pune and soon joined the organisation as a development engineer too. That is how Sudha Murthy became the first female engineer at Tata Motors, where she met her husband Narayana Murthy and later built one of India's most famous software firms - Infosys.

Narayana Murthy conceptualized, articulated and implemented the Global Delivery Model (GDM) which has become the backbone of the Indian software industry. GDM is based on collaborative distributed software development principles and has resulted in the delivery of superior quality software to global customers on time and within budget. Today Infosys became the leader in innovation in software technology, quality, productivity, customer focus, employee satisfaction, physical and technological infrastructure. In 1996, Sudha Murthy became one of the first trustees of the Infosys Foundation , the company's non-profit arm which has been instrumental in building hospitals, schools, orphanages, rehabilitation centres, as well as more than 14,000 toilets and over 60,000 libraries for the underprivileged sections of the society. Over the years, she has helped rehabilitate over 3000 sex workers.

As a writer, philanthropist and teacher, her social work is spread across healthcare, education, women empowerment, public hygiene and poverty alleviation. She is also a prolific writer who has published extensively in Kannada and English. Her books reflect the ethos of the Indian culture, touch upon social issues and reinstate her philosophies for life through fictional narratives.
