














Look Us Up

RENU DADLANI IS PRESERVING AGE-OLD CRAFT TECHNIQUES TO GIVE PURVEYORS A PIECE OF INDIAN HERITAGE.

enu Dadlani's mantra since she started her eponymous label 20 years ago hasn't wavered in the slightest; to maintain the legacy of traditional Indian hand-embroideries in her ensembles has been of paramount importance. And she has succeeded at doing so with much aplomb. Her designs are testament to the adage that old really is old, and that classic elements can never be replaced by fleeting trends. She tells us more about why her brand is the real deal...

## What comes to mind when you think of the essence of this brand?

Thread crafts and needle techniques on small frames, on wide wooden ones (Adda) and a few from the looms; these are the traditions we are trying to retain. You can simply call them chikankari, Parsi gara and Kashmiri embroideries. Each craft has its own aesthetic, and many of which involve age-old motifs, patterns and near-extinct techniques, that we make for our discerning clients. We use georgettes, different types of silks for our couture collection and for our Spring/ Summer Luxury Pret Collection, we use a pure variety of organic cottons, chanderis, kota-doria, etc. Our ethnic collection includes a variety of Indian classic silhouettes.

#### Tell us about your latest collection...

It's called Maheen, meaning fine or detailed. It stands for the aspiration to achieve perfection. It stands for the passion and will which goes behind creating designs in which every small



detail, Weave and thread has been carefully taken care of in order to bring to you the best of our authentic heritage. The concept behind the collection is to bring the rich heritage back as a modern classic because we believe that the present-day is a reflection of the past. The signs of those lost realms of ancient times are brought alive again with the engraved work of our craftsmen. The collection includes an expansive range of bridal lehengas, time-honoured sarees, anarkalis and jackets, ghararas, skirts and much more. Hand embroidered over two years and brought to life by multiple artisans,

#### What are you currently working on that we can look forward to?

every piece is a treasure in itself!

We are launching our new bridal collection of handcrafted ensembles which will be a reflection of our recent collection, Maheen. With this collection, we are trying to bring the finest version of art in different forms, colours and designs. Our new collection incorporates authentic pastel chikankari outfits, solid hues on traditional Parsi gara garments and subtle multi-coloured surfaces in the Kashmiri collection. A variety of lehengas can be found as well, which allows a bride to choose her desired look, whether traditional or modern. Along with the collection, there are many exciting services and surprises that will be available to clients.

#### Why is the #vocalforlocal movement close to your heart?

The movement is close to heart because we have been working towards it since the idea of the label was conceived. For us, Vocal for Local means feeling proud of our local heritage, giving encouragement, upliftment and support to local practices, using raw materials, traditional methods, and age-old techniques being practiced by Indian weavers, artisans and embroiderers. We are supporting vocal for local by using traditional surface ornamentation techniques, preserving traditional skills, techniques, methods, weaves, embroideries and promoting these local age-old crafts worldwide through our collections.



#### **OG Wedding Date**

# GUEST LIST NAVGATION

YOU'RE FORCED TO HAVE A TINY WEDDING WHETHER YOU LIKE IT OR NOT, BUT HOW DO YOU DECIDE WHO STAYS AND WHO GETS AXED FROM THE GUEST LIST? A GUIDE TO TREADING CAREFULLY **BY JEENA J BILLIMORIA** 

f you're getting married any time soon, you're going to face limitations, such as a very small wedding and an even smaller guest list. \_\_\_\_\_\_ That sounds easy enough, and might also be a small relief from a costsaving perspective... Until you realise that shaving down your guest list is a nightmare because, after the plus ones, parents' friends' friends, random acquaintances, and annoying distant relatives

have all been brutally axed, you still have another wave of people to eliminate. And then some. But, now, these are good friends, or extended but important-ish family members. Still, rules are rules in the situation we find ourselves in, so how do you navigate uninviting or simply not inviting people to your wedding? With tact and politeness, of course.

Read on to know how you can get away with it without making it to the top of people's hitlists. •

#### THE BIG STORY

# Convert a physical presence to a virtual one

If you cannot have your guests actually attend your wedding but, at the same time, can't imagine one without specific people present to share in the happiness, do the next best thing and convert it into a Zoom video link of the ceremony. Let them know how important they are to you, and how they have to be present in some form. This way, even if they're not physically around you, you'll at least find comfort in the knowledge that they're watching from not so far away, and they won't feel disappointed either.

#### Say it with a card

If it was to be a massive wedding with more guests than you could call and speak to individually, have your wedding card designer print out little notes that can be sent to everyone informing them that, regretfully, in light of the way things are, you must rescind. For people who are close to the family, you could even send out a small something (such as chocolates, tealights or a plant) to soften any ego bruising.

#### Say it face to face

You and your husband-to-be could also record a video together explaining the predicament you both find yourselves in, and apologise for not having guests be there to celebrate. Keep it short and sweet, but also sincere. You can send this video out on WhatsApp, email or upload it to your wedding website, if you have one.

#### Play the family card

To simplify things greatly, you can just inform guests that your wedding is limited to family members only. This way, people won't feel so bad if some friends still got to come, while they themselves couldn't.

#### Plan B

Offer guests an alternative plan: say that there will be a big blowout celebration in future that they absolutely must attend, but that, for the moment, the actual wedding will be limited to just a small bunch. As and when said blowout is possible, stick to your word, and let the drinks and merriment flow.

#### Pick your battles wisely

If there are some guests who would selfishly and shamelessly make things more stressful, awkward or uncomfortable for you if they were left uninvited, and if salvaging that relationship later would be

a gargantuan task, it is perhaps better to include them in the list and make your peace with it. Not everything goes to plan at the best of times, and you will also have to pick your battles and roll with the punches from time to time. Yes, despite it being your day.

#### Uninviting guests

If, in the event you've already sent out invitations but now have to uninvite someone, it's always best to do it personally via a phone call, or a beautifully-worded letter explaining that, although you'd have loved their company, the given situation is forcing you to keep the guest list very tight. Mention that their presence will be greatly missed, and that you look forward to celebrating with them on the other side of the pandemic. <sup>(2)</sup>

for this interview was almost robotic. All penned down in a notepad like a laundry list. Even my introduction was rehearsed. A few mock calls to my sibling to check if my phone was working and to ensure everything went smoothly; a glass of coffee and all interview paraphernalia handy, I called Diana Penty.

As luck would have it, the network was troublesome as ever, and we were stuck in a loop of calling one another and listening to busy tones until, finally, one of our calls got through. We exchanged our pleasantries and got down to business – namely, the lockdown.

Fresh out of the lockdown, when things in Mumbai have steadily started to open up to the general public, we chatted about those who'd outgrown their cabin fever and shared mutual disappointment in those who still don't wear masks. Penty is as passionate about her philanthropy as she is about movies and her pet friend, Victoria. She believes the pandemic has brought a lot of people closer and therefore done more good than it has harm... Understanding that being together in spirit is the only way forward to a peaceful future. These conversations weren't quite touchpoints in my notepad, but that's Diana Penty for you sensitive, astute, calm.

From much-looked-forward to fashion weeks moving online, to using her favourite night repair serum as a highlighter, Penty then got candid about relationships, marriage, outfits and movies. Excerpts from the interview...

#### How has your lockdown experience been, considering it's an unprecedented first for all of us?

Diana Penty: It's hard to really put down in one word or a sentence because it's just been an experience. It's something none of us ever expected to happen and we didn't know what it was going to entail, nor what to expect. For the whole world, it was a first for this generation.

Hopefully, we'll never have to see it again! This lockdown has been a time to restart and reset in a way. It gave us time to •

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just sit back and put things into perspective, and give a second thought to things we never had time for before. We've been taking things for granted for so long because we've been caught up in our lives, caught up in this hectic, quick-paced race, that we never really got the time to sit back and just think about life. This period gave us all the opportunity to do that by default. It's something that we needed to do and was long overdue. So, in a lot of ways, there was a lot of outward and self-learning to be done, which I feel I have been able to do. Things have been put into perspective. I hope that, moving forward, we keep these things in mind and move with a new energy...

What is that one thing you

## enjoyed doing the most during this time?

D: Spending time with [my dog] Victoria would be the highlight of my lockdown because I never had the opportunity to do that in the year-and-a-half that she's been with us. This lockdown has given us the opportunity to get to know her better, and she's got to know us better. We're now absolutely inseparable and have had great quality time. Now, she's so accustomed to having us all at home, that when I start travelling again she'll miss me – and I her.

#### You've also been quite active with your philanthropic work. You recently collaborated with Salaam Bombay for the Khaki Project. Why do you think it's important to give back and stay united, especially in such times?

D: It just is; it's important to give back anyway. Irrespective of the times we are in, every now and then, it's important to do your bit. Especially if you're in the position to do it. It's something that I want to do and something that makes me happy. Giving back has always been something that makes me happy! Also, I do feel in times of adversity, people do come together. I've seen that happen a lot during this lockdown as well, where we were witness to the unyielding spirit of Mumbai – how people were going out of their way to help others. People showed support, were there for each other ... Hence, we felt this was our own way of giving the Mumbai police, who have worked day and night tirelessly to keep us safe, some basic but essential equipment to arm themselves with. Even the health care workers, for that matter. Raising these funds was our way of thanking them in whatever small way we could, which, in turn, helped them stay safe while working.

#### The pandemic has called for new changes. What do you think Indian weddings will look like going forward?

D: I feel the whole wedding culture has changed a lot. Everybody has just moved online – meetings, work, and even fashion weeks, which was a first. I had a friend who hosted a digital wedding ceremony as well from another part of the world. So, it seems to be quite a thing now. I think that's going to be the way forward for a while, until things finally settle down. This pandemic isn't suddenly going to just disappear, so these are the things we're going to have to do, move online as much as possible. •

# What would your dream wedding destination be?

D: I haven't really thought about it, but I generally love the mountains. They're just beautiful, calm, and therapeutic. It gives me a sense of peace. So, if I could just be surrounded by mountains with just a little nip in the air, I'd be happy.

## And what about your dream wedding ensemble?

D: I haven't thought of anything at all, really. Through all my various modelling assignments and film shoots, I've had to play the bride so many times, even if it's just walking down the ramp as a showstopper sometimes. Wedding outfits are absolutely stunning and gorgeous, but they're also so heavy. I've made a mental note to never wear I'VE MADE A MENTAL NOTE TO NEVER WEAR SOMETHING TOO HEAVY AT MY OWN WEDDING.

something too heavy. It's definitely going to be something light, easy and comfortable because I've always had a very minimal aesthetic when it comes to my style and life in general. Comfort for me is everything because only then can I have a good time. I don't want to be tugging at my outfit and, by the end of it, feel my body hurt because of how heavy it is! I really don't want to be in that position! [Laughs]

## So, you're definitely a minimalist then?

D: Definitely a minimalist, yes. There's no doubt about it. I feel awkward with maximalism, I don't think I'd be able to pull it off.

#### Is there an heirloom piece that you'd steal from your mother's closet?

D: Whatever I've wanted to steal from my mother, I've already stolen long ago! [Laughs] My mom and I just share a lot of stuff, not clothes so much because we're slightly different sizes, but accessories and shoes. There is a black lace dress that belonged to my great grandmum, which is really beautiful and was so classic, I had to take it. I can carry this off even today; it's one of those pieces you can wear many years down the line and it will still be appropriate and in style.

# How do you think luxury fashion can be more sustainable?

D: I feel we need to slow down in terms of changing trends and trend cycles because, if every season we come up with something completely new, then that makes the older season's clothes redundant and that's not sustainable. When it comes to using fabrics and textiles, recyclable ones can be a great alternative. As a designer, when you are constructing a garment, the amount of waste needs to be reduced and, if you have a lot of waste, you need to think of a way in which to recycle it. Also, using more organic materials and cotton as opposed to synthetic fabrics need to

be incorporated.

I think Stella McCartney has done a great job at this. She's made a conscious effort to stay away from fur and leather, and, yet, her creations are considered luxurious, super chic and high-end. So, if designers can set that trend, it would go a long way. Repeating outfits should be more normalised. It's been a thing to not be spotted in the same outfit, but I think that's slowly changing now.

# Beauty Quick Fix

## A beauty and fashion trend you dislike?

D: The overliner trend that's catching up in makeup, and head-to-toe crochet.

## One beauty hack you discovered during the lockdown?

D: Allowing your skin to breathe and nourishing your under-eyes due to the constant strain on them. I would use an under eye cream not just before bed but also during the day.

## What does your skincare routine look like?

D: It is very basic. I wash my face with a light face wash and then I use Estée Lauder's Advanced Night Repair post face wash; let it set in and then I use my under-eye cream. In the day, I use a light moisturiser while, at night, I usually use something heavier, thicker and creamier.

## And what do you think are the beauty essentials for a bride-to-be?

D: It depends from person to person. A lipstick shade that suits your skin tone and, matches your outfit and of course, highlighter. I love highlighter!

# What is your take on the institution of marriage?

D: I definitely respect the institution of marriage. It's a very sacred and pure sacrament. I personally think it's just become a label. It's like putting a label on something that should anyway exist. If you are in a serious relationship with somebody that you genuinely love, respect and care for, then whether you're married or not, I would still in my mind treat that relationship as sacred. So sacred that whether I'm married or not should not make a difference. Trust, respect and love are equally important to create a strong foundation in a relationship. Having said that, whether you choose to get married or not shouldn't make any difference. It's about compatibility and understanding between the couple.

In *Happy Bhaag Jayegi*, you played the role of a free-spirited runaway bride. What

#### attracted you to that role?

D: I think the character of Happy is what attracted me to it. She was so different; quite the opposite of my own personality type. So, for me, it was just so intriguing to play somebody who is so unabashed, says whatever comes to her mind, and is unfiltered whereas I am very measured. I always think before I say something. I knew it was going to be really difficult for me to do it, but I had to. The story was really fun and when the director narrated it to me, I was rolling on the floor laughing. There was something about Happy and I thought: I have to play this girl!

#### What other projects zbesides Shiddat are you currently working on?

D: I'm reading a few scripts and I'm pretty certain that something is going to close very soon. •

# In The Face Of A Pandemic

Three stalwarts of the Indian fashion industry and our very own Editor, **Ruchika Mehta,** discuss the future of bridal fashion.

ashion First' by Femina X Grazia was a one-of-a-kind virtual fashion showcase. Starting on the 30th of October up until the 1st of November, we got to see some insightful webinars by

industry experts, masterclasses and DIY sessions by various celebrity stylists and influencers, and special digital pop-ups to shop the latest trends. One of the main events of this celebration of fashion was the webinar about bridal trends amid a pandemic. Ruchika Mehta, our editor, talked to three renowned Indian fashion designers – JJ Valaya, Suneet Varma and Nikhil Mehra. A range of topics was discussed, from changes in design sensibilities and consumer preferences, to sustainability and the future of Indian bridal couture.

In this pandemic, the big fat Indian wedding has been put on a diet. With multiple restrictions, a smaller guest count and intimate settings, weddings in 2020 have been one of a kind, to say the least. "Everybody has had to cut off the extra frills and fringes, and really come down to what the core of their design ethos is," says courtier Suneet Varma, who has been dressing Indian and

NRI brides for almost three decades. With not as many functions, brides and their families aren't buying as lavishly as they would normally. "Not only do people not want to spend a lot of money, they also don't want to look boastful," he adds.

JJ Valaya went on to point out a great observation about the Indian mindset. "Indians by nature are a very emotional sort of race and, for them, a wedding is not just a function; it's a memory that they want to hold on to for ages," he says. The pandemic is transient, but a wedding is a memory of a lifetime that people are never going to want to forget. "It's something that Indians revel in and I don't think that's going to ever change," he adds. Even though the pandemic has definitely had an adverse effect on the fashion Industry, as long as people's sentiments towards weddings remain the same, the bridal market will be up and running again soon enough. brand ethos in place and anything transient can't change that basic ethos... So yes, we're going through a kind of tidal wave at the moment but things will get back to normal," says JJ Valaya.

While the pandemic is negative in more ways than one, there's also a positive side to it. People's priorities are shifting. They are re-learning how to live their lives. After being cocooned in their homes for so long, when people come out to celebrate in a post pandemic world, it's going to be grand and extravagant. With a more appreciative audience than ever, the future of Indian bridal couture looks bright.

Nikhil Mehra expands on this thought. "When the consciousness of the entire globe changes in one go, you can rest assured only beautiful things are going to come out of this," he says. "This is a great time for us to have a look back at where we come from and where we are going to go."

When it comes to the changing preferences of the consumer, brides are looking for more toneddown pieces to match the intimate setting. "People are looking at lighter colours, lighter fabrics and an overall lighter feeling," says Suneet Varma. On being asked his opinion on matching masks, Varma was quick to express his distaste. "I don't think people want the memory of the pandemic to linger onto the memory of a lifetime," he says.

The panel went on to talk about one of the most prominent

buzzwords in the industry – sustainability. JJ Valaya made an excellent point when he said that, "India is probably the only country which is actually producing and consuming couture at the same pace." The timeless appeal of Indian bridal wear makes it perfect to pass down from one generation to the other. It can't get more sustainable than that!

Another major change in the industry has been the introduction of e-commerce. As JJ Valaya puts it, it's like "having a store in every city of the world!" The panel unanimously agreed that even though it definitely increases their reach and makes their brand more accessible, nothing can replace the human experience of touch-and-feel. "There's no denying that real time and virtual are going to be in parallel existence, we all just need to get used to and celebrate both with equal zest," says JJ Valaya.

With final thoughts on adapting and reinventing, the discussion came to an end. An excellent panel discussing some very relevant points, this webinar was as insightful as it was enlightening. •

#### BRIEFLY TELL US A LITTLE ABOUT YOUR HUGELY POPULAR LABEL...

The brand was formed three years ago when I started out. My collections are showcased at various leading multi-brand stores like Pernia's Popup Shop, Asmairaa in Delhi, Mumbai, Hyderabad and Ahmedabad. I have been customising and catering to my clients in different parts of the world, be it cities in the USA, UK, or Canada.

#### WHAT DOES THE SHILPI AHUJA BRIDE LOOK LIKE?

Every bride has a vague idea in their head about what they want and what they don't. If I am making a lehenga from the scratch for a bride, I take the effort to get to know her; understand her choices, temperament, etc, to create a look that would suit her completely. If a



bride were to select an outfit from my ready-to-wear bridal collection, she'd be met with beautiful colours, the perfect fit, a blend of zardozi, pearls, thread work and a lot of embellishments that would complement the entire look.

#### YOU'VE MARKED THIS YEAR?

This year has been so different from others in so many ways, but some things still remained the same. Because the gathering sizes for events has diminished, some of my clients chose a relatively lighter outfit, while others still went all out!

Brides walk into my store for their D-day lehenga as well as fusion wear for other wedding functions. #### TELL US ABOUT YOUR LATEST COLLECTION, HIKAYAT-E-DIL...

The deep toned colours blended with softer tones create a joyful vibe, with prints that rekindle the art forms of bandhej and lehariya. These prints have found an instant connection with people. Thread work, antique coin work, zardozi and other intricate handwork make this a truly beautiful collection.

#### WHAT'S NEXT FOR THE BRAND?

We have already been doing a lot of customised formal wear for men and kids. Now we plan to go all out with these collections.

Playing muse for Shehla Khan's collection is actor, Alaya F. Strong, independent and full of life, Alaya brings the millennial point of view to the table. Even though she is just a movie old, Alaya F.'s sartorial presence has been recognised and applauded. Representing the modern-bride, the

young and effervescent actor looks like a vision in these contemporary ensembles.

Nineties metal grunge and Indian bridal wear is a combo we don't get to see every day. How did you decide you wanted to take inspiration from the grunge scene? What elements have you incorporated?

SK: So there is no grunge element in the garments; in fact, they are most true to our aesthetic. Just the way we have presented and styled the campaign has a '90s grunge vibe to it; be it the backdrop or the silver boots with the lehenga. A blazer with a maang tika and high-slit lehenga skirt are some elements we have used reminiscing the '90s.

#### Have the bride's preferences changed in any way during the pandemic?

SK: Bridal preferences haven't changed as such, but a huge factor that has come along with the pandemic as a general demand is sustainability. It works both ways; we as designers make sure that we create with minimum waste and in an environmentally friendly way while maintaining durability, whereas the bride today wants to invest in something with reusable and recycleable value.

# What is the design process that goes behind turning inspiration into beautiful garments?

SK: So my inspiration comes from anything, it can be from a book to a film, a colour, a photograph, painting or even a decade in fashion. Once I get inspired by one or more of these, I always go back to vintage silhouettes to take inspiration for cuts, embroideries and just styling in general. A melange of both these aspects helps me design each look or garment for a collection.

# Any personal favourite pieces in the collection?

SK: I love each one. so I couldn't be partial to any one style! However, the cropped blazer with a lace •

lehenga is something very new and avant-garde. Even the lace blouse and lilac lehenga skirt with a slit are very minimal but statement-making. We also have some cocktail saris and print sets in the next drop, which I would wear myself to my next event.

### What is your vision for Indian couture?

SK: The new couture is sustainable, environment friendly and has recyclable value. This is how we,

as designers, are coming together in the industry to serve our responsibility to the economy, the environment as well as the ecosystem.

### What is your favourite thing about this collection?

**AF**: To be honest, I love almost everything from this collection, but my favourite piece is the bright pink lehenga with the lace top; it's so young and fresh, while still being so retro. It's bright and bold and still so classic and elegant!

### What's your personal style when it comes to dressing up?

**AF**: The thing I love most is how ethereal and elegant I feel in traditional clothes, whether it's a simple kurti or a highly embellished and embroidered heavy lehenga, I always feel like a princess when I'm wearing traditional clothes! This Diwali was made of much smaller gatherings as compared to the large parties that happen every year! But I never let go of an opportunity to dress up, so I wore a gorgeous Shehla Khan lehenga because now I'm totally biased to her designs! I absolutely love them!

# Have you thought about what you would want to wear for your big day?

AF: Pastel colours with a lot of delicate, beautiful details! I don't have any more specifications because I like to be surprised and not plan things out in too much detail...

#### What has your quarantine style looked like? Has it rubbed off on your going-out style?

AF: I've made it a point to not laze around in my pyjamas through this lockdown! So my go-to uniform has been a pair of denim shorts with a white T-shirt.

# You're a creative soul too! Where do you find inspiration for your art?

AF: Art, for me, is a way to clear the clutter in my mind and focus single-mindedly on something. I'm almost never actually thinking about the drawing while I'm creating it. In school, I would doodle so I could pay attention; it was the strangest thing. My ability to listen and learn is a lot better while I'm drawing; it puts me in a unique state of mind that's quite hard to explain. My art is usually black-and-white, sometimes with one element of colour. I've only just found my style, so I let it flow naturally! It's only when I look at it much later that I'm able to see the meaning in it so clearly. I'm so glad I've finally put my art out on social media and that people are getting to see it. ♀

In a conversation with Femina, Sanjay spoke animatedly about his collection, Moomal, at length.

# Your collection is rooted in the craft, culture, and folklore of Rajasthan. What inspired you to do this?

I was born in Rajasthan, so a collection drawing from there has evolved over the years. This collection, in particular, draws from a continued lens of questioning the perceptions of classic and folk.

Designers often try to sell aspirations through their clothes,

#### but your collection brought relatability to fashion. Was that a conscious choice?

Films have always been an important part of our storytelling narrative. The process of creating the collection and conceptualising began last year, but the content creation happened during the

#### TRADITION TALES

Did you know, India used to be the most desired country for creating exotic fabrics that were embedded with precious metals? Our country was the top exporter of expensive fabrics that were famous all over the world. But the industrial revolution changed the course of our textiles. Nevertheless, fabric production in India is still intact but not flourishing as before. What can we do to change that? Well, every state in our country comes bearing a traditional method of creating fabrics that has lived through decades of change. You can rest assured that it is made by local artisans and isn't a product of the power loom. Benarasi silk, Paithani, Kanjivaram, Mysore silk and Pochampally are a few examples of such fabrics.

You might argue that traditional fabrics cost a pretty penny. But, if maintained properly, they can stand the test of time. Also, you can shop smart by going truly local. For example, if you live in Uttar Pradesh or nearby, a Benarasi sari might be more within your price bracket than a Kanjeevaram from Tamil Nadu and vice versa. So, opting for a fabric that you get uber-locally can help you stay within your budget. Even embellishments – embroidery, stonework, etc. – can be sourced locally.

Artisans have been a crucial part of our economy, contributing their skills in crafts that have been suppressed due to industrialisation. Taking the initiative of buying a local bridal garment will not only benefit you but will also help numerous artisans expand their business across the country.

The process was delayed, but, with the amount of love that has come our way, it was all worth the wait. We started work on the store in early 2020, aiming to launch by April. # Tell us a little about yourselves and how brand Dabiri was formed...

**Ambika Jain:** Dabiri's a traditional Indian fashion brand, started in 2003 by Divya, who has had an innate passion of creating Indian silhouettes from an early age. In 2006, I joined



AJ: Rather than having the bride scale back, we try


and customise according to the client's needs and requirements...

# RINGIN SAFETY!

Hand <u>sanitisers</u> might be the current 'friend' for your hands, but they don't get along well with your BFFs... the rings you wear! **Radhika Sathe-Patwardhan** finds out how the two can co-exist without the risk of damage.

> s the wedding season arrives, you'll be bringing out your jewellery sets to wear during the festivities of the [few] weddings you attend. With guidelines in place to use sanitisers and soaps, there are also the side-effects of over-usage of sanitiser to keep in mind! Jewellery designer Sangeeta Boochra helps us understand the damage your rings could face, and what can be done as a precaution.

#### DAMAGE ALERT

Excessive use of sanitiser could damage your wedding ring, and jewellery as a whole, in these ways, says Boochra:

Silver gets tarnished and oxidised; you might see some spots and small holes on the plain surface of the metal. If you're not using alcohol-based sanitiser, the one you're using will have chlorine in it, which isn't suitable for silver. High sanitiser usage (constant use for seven to eight days), might lead to small pore formation, depleted rhodium, dull plating, blackening of the surface as also unevenness. Yellow gold won't show an immediate effect, but it can tarnish over time and become dull.

- \* If the purity of gold is 22–24K, the shine will last longer as compared to wedding rings made with less purity, such as 9 to 20K gold. This happens because gold is mixed with other alloys. Hence, it reacts when it comes in touch with alcohol and other chemicals mainly used to make sanitiser such as: isopropyl, ethyl alcohol and fragrance, which are very bad for jewellery. Gold jewellery made with 22–24K gold purity does tarnish and gets damaged, but the process is slower as compared to lesser gold jewellery.
- \* Diamonds on a ring would not display an immediate severe effect, but they will lose their shine. A layer starts forming on the diamond gradually due to the chemicals in the sanitiser.

This was our first experimentation with Candid Photography which is a very popular trend today. Back then, it was a very offbeat approach. It was a daunting and unknown path to follow, till we got the overwhelming feedback from the client, their families and friends. That experience was surreal and that is how it all started. We haven't looked back since.

Our team has grown slowly and steadily, undergoing many learning curves. We don't work with any inhibitions that may stand in the way of producing high-quality work. We aspire to create pictures that can be windows to those beautiful memories being created by some amazing souls.

It would take around two weeks to show and then, slowly, it would increase and damage the brilliance of the diamond.


- \* The prong setting or collet setting, on which the gemstone is set, starts becoming loose with time after we continuously clean our hands with sanitiser. This happens because a layer of rhodium or gold or silver starts depleting and hence makes it loose to hold the diamond. This can result in your gemstone falling from the ring.
- \* Precious and semi-precious gemstone-studded rings would show an adverse effect too and are more prone to damage because of the property of the gemstone. For example, an emerald/ aquamarine or tourmaline-studded ring would have chances of damage within four to five days because of the properties of the stone; the gemstone comes from a mineral composed of beryl. It is very soft and fragile; it cracks easily, changes colour, etc. Hence the chemicals used to make sanitiser with alcohol have a very adverse effect on it. All other expensive gemstones such as rubies, sapphires, tanzanites, amethysts, citrines, etc. are fragile and will be damaged if sanitisers are used regularly. Gemstones will lose their shine, and furthermore, might crack too.

#### CARE FACTOR

With the current health precautions, we cannot avoid using sanitisers, and one has to use it regularly. Boochra suggests taking these precautions for your jewellery:


- \* The safest solution is to remove your jewellery before sanitising your hand and then, once it's dry, wear it again.
- \* Clean your jewellery with a soft white cloth regularly. Remove the jewellery at night. Dip it in hot water and wipe it clean with a soft and damp cloth, then keep it aside to dry. Wear it in the morning.
- \* Store in a dry place away from humidity, moisture, and extreme temperatures; it's best kept in its box or pouch to prevent scratching, chipping or entanglement.
- \* Rings and bracelets should be worn sparingly to avoid damage through impact.
- \* Don't forget to remove your rings when washing up or taking a shower, as soap particles may become lodged in stone settings and crevices. Soaps can also leave a film over metal and stones, creating a dull appearance.
- \* Exposed to the atmosphere, all silver is prone to oxidisation and consequent tarnishing. Gentle rubbing with a silver cleaning cloth will restore the original brilliance of the surface.

- \* Do not use liquid cleaners for carved silver jewellery as the liquid dries into the engraving.
- \* If you wear your gold-plated silver jewellery for significant periods, the plating will eventually wear out. To restore its appearance, you can have it re-plated.
- \* Make sure your jewellery is not in regular contact with hard surfaces, which may scratch or wear down the plating or enamelling.
- \* When dressing, the jewellery should always be put on last as makeup, cosmetics and perfumes can cause damage to delicate items.
- \* All stone jewellery requires extra care and consideration during wearing to protect the setting as well as to safeguard the gemstone it holds.

# Friends, family: the best reviewers and helpers







A handful of rose petals A few sprigs of fresh rosemary ½ cup sugar 1 tsp sesame oil



# Get These Health Check-Ups Done Before Marriage (Or Even After)

You need to ensure your health is at its peak for you to be able to enjoy the changes marriage brings about! These check-ups will cover all the bases. By Radhika Sathe-Patwardhan

> ou'll be going through many changes – physically, emotionally, mentally, and even maybe geographically – after

marriage. To be able to enjoy the changes, and cope with any small (or big!) hurdle that might come your way, you need to ensure you aren't suffering from any health problems. You need to be aware of your health history, as well as your current health status. The best way to know that is by getting a full check-up done.

Here's a list of tests to take, not just as a

newlywed, but advised for women across all age groups.

### A blood test to know the blood count:

This will detect anaemia, if present.

### A blood test to know your thyroid hormone profile:

The thyroid affects fertility, period cycles and blood flow, as well as weight loss or gain.

### A blood test to know your lipid profile:

This helps detect the level of cholesterol. Increased cholesterol is directly related to BP and heart-related problems.

#### A blood test for infection

**screening:** This will detect any dormant infections, such as HIV or Hepatitis B.

### A blood test to detect blood sugar levels:

This will detect if you have diabetes or are at risk. Do both types of blood tests for this – fasting and postprandial (post-meal).

#### A blood test for thalassemia:

It helps to detect if someone has defective thalassemia haemoglobin, which can be a cause of low haemoglobin. It is important if you are planning pregnancy, as there is a 25 per cent chance that your baby might have the same gene. •

#### A blood test to detect Rubella IgG:

It helps to detect whether you have had Rubella (German Measles) infection immunisation or not. Rubella is a common cause of miscarriage in pregnancy.

#### A blood test to detect Anti **Mullerian Hormone (AMH):**

AMH relates to a women's fertility. This test helps if a woman finds it difficult to conceive.

#### Mammography:

This is a breast cancer screening test.

#### Pap smear:

This test detects cervical cancer. It is done at the neck of the womb (cervix) during an internal examination. It helps to identify pre-cancerous cells, so that treatment can be initiated before the cancer starts. One needs to do the test once in three years.

#### **Bone Mineral Density (BMD)** scan:

This detects osteopenia and osteoporosis; it helps detect thinning of bones early so that treatment can be started to prevent fractures.

#### Pelvic sonography (USG):

It helps give an overview of women's genital organs. It identifies any swelling of the ovaries (cysts), fibroids or thickened inner skin of the uterus. 📀

# BE PREPARED - PERIOD

Going to be that time of month on D-Day? Here's what you need to know to pre-pone or postpone your <u>period</u>, and what to do if you're caught by surprise. By **Radhika Sathe-Patwardhan** 

eriods on D-Day? Apprehensive about what to do? Fear not, we have advice that will help you out. Has it come as a surprise on the most important day of your life? We have your back. Do note that if you're opting to take medicines, then consult your gynaecologist two months in advance.

#### PRE-PONE

One way to not worry on D-Day is to have it dealt with beforehand. Plan your periods to come a week or so earlier, so that you have enough time after to enjoy the celebrations. So, ideally, start these remedies two weeks or more before. Here are some natural ways to pre-pone your menstrual cycle.

#### Drink hot turmeric water twice daily for

**15** days. It will make your periods come up to five days earlier. Make this drink by mixing three to nine grams of turmeric in a glass of hot water and drink it daily. According to Dr. Michael Tierra in his research article, turmeric regulates the menses. It is an emmenagogue, which stimulates menstruation.

Have parsley and pepper juice daily. Take three doses of two grams of parsley each, boiled in 150ml of water, through the day. "Apiol and myristicin stimulate contractions of the uterus," noted Dr Lovneet Batra, Clinical Nutritionist, Fortis La Famme; these two are found in parsley.

Eat a ripe papaya. According to Dr Neethu S Kumar in her research paper, "The surprising health benefits of papaya seeds: A review," papaya stimulates menstruation. It induces excessive heat in your body and the carotene in papaya stimulates the estrogen hormone which makes your period come sooner than expected. Eat as much papaya as you can for this.





#### Have a fenugreek seed concoction daily.

Soak three teaspoons of fenugreek seeds in a glass of clean water overnight. In the morning, boil it until frothy. Strain the seeds out and drink it hot, daily. This can prepone and trigger your periods within two-three days. According to Paige Passano in her paper "The many uses of methi" (methi is fenugreek), it is a uterine stimulant which makes the uterus go through the motions of contracting and expanding, inducing menstruation.


#### POSTPONE

If you're looking to postpone your menstrual cycle, then you need to keep these pointers in mind. Start the postponing regimen at least 15 days prior to the scheduled date of your period.

**Exercise.** Exercising releases endorphin or 'the happy hormone'. It helps reduce stress that might have accumulated due to the wedding planning shenanigans. Cardio exercises are best for this, and they are easily manageable through the hectic wedding planning days. Just opt for a 20 minute run in the morning and once in the day. This not only helps you increase your happy hormone count, but also provides for a break from the planning.



#### IF YOUR MENSTRUAL CYCLE STARTS UNEXPECTEDLY, DON'T GET BOGGED DOWN WITH WORRY.



Avoid spicy food. Hot, spicy food increases the heat in the body, which can induce periods.

Avoid food that increases heat in the body. The food items listed above in the pre-pone section? Definitely avoid those!

Have a gram lentil soup. It helps postpone your periods, and having it daily till the day you want

to not have periods. Fry the lentils and then grind them. Make a soup out of this mix and enjoy.

Drink vinegar water. Add three to four spoons of vinegar to a glass of filtered drinking water and drink up. This will help you to delay your menstrual symptoms and even delay your periods by three to four days.

#### **OVERCOMING SURPRISE**

If your menstrual cycle starts unexpectedly, don't get bogged down by worry. Here are tips on what to do in such cases:

Keep an emergency kit ready. Make sure you carry enough sanitary pads, tampons and extra panties in it.

Wear an extra slip inside your garment. So, if at all there is any spotting, it will not appear on the main garment.

Add pain-killers to the medical kit. Ensure you have pain meds that are period cramp-specific in your medical kit.

Avoid high heels. These can aggravate the aches in your back and legs, so it's best to avoid them.

Sip on ginger tea. This helps ease out the cramps and is also said to reduce the blood flow. •

Also, we would want to preserve our reproductive system as much as possible!

• Being physically fit goes a long way in feeling mentally and emotionally fit. Due to the release of endorphins, one is always in a better space to make wise decisions. Hence it would be a good idea to do any kind of training that one desires. Be it strength, HIIT, swimming, running or even dancing.

• Managing stress is again an important factor! We would want to delay menopause. Prevent the radical attack by keeping the skin more supple and again combating any disease or infection caused by stress.

#### WHAT FOOD YOU CONSUME ALSO MAKES A HUGE DIFFERENCE IN YOUR HEALTH AND FITNESS. CHAWLA SUGGESTS:

• Consume real foods, meaning whole unpackaged foods.

• Whole grains, legumes and pulses: they help sustain good energy levels and avoid sugar dip

• Ensure lean protein at least three times a day, for





e.g. eggs, low-fat paneer, chicken and fish work wonders for hair, skin and nails.

• Colourful fruits and vegetables: they are powerful antioxidants (rainbow plate) and a good source of fibre which helps in aiding digestion and immunity. Sources are apple, pear, orange, papaya, berries, peach and plums.

• Are a powerhouse of instant energy and glow for the face.  $\diamond$ 



It is imperative to take care of gut health considering 70% of the immune system lies in the gut and also serotonin (the feel-good hormone) production takes place in the gut. Hence it is important to ensure adequate prebiotics and probiotics with food sources and supplements.
Prebiotics like amaranth, artichoke, leeks, asparagus

• Probiotics like kefir, yoghurt, kombucha, sauerkraut

Food sources of powerful antioxidants (vitamin A, C, E and glutathione) that delay the ageing process
Omega 3 sources to help in healthy skin and metabolism

Fluids to help to flush out toxins. You can consume plain water, infused water, coconut water, buttermilk, lime water and diluted vegetable juice.
You need to avoid consuming margarine, refined flour, alcohol, sugar, fried foods, food with trans-fat, and smoking.

### It is not something one only needs in times of difficulty, but to ensure you have your happily-ever-after post-marriage. By **Radhika Sathe-Patwardhan**

ou might have a love marriage or an arranged one. But does a love marriage mean you know the other person very well, and won't ever have any differences and problems by default? The answer is no – though it may surprise people. Either way, and whether you find him yourself or through a third party, you need to ensure that you solve all the glaring problems you could have post marriage, from the get-go. Cue the <u>pre-marital counselling</u>. You might have questions – what exactly does it entail? What can one expect from pre-marital counselling sessions? How does it help? We have put together the answers to these questions just for you.

A pre-marital counselling session with a counsellor will help you understand each other better, ask questions you might not have thought to ask, and make you discuss topics that you might otherwise take for granted. A research study shows that 30 per cent of couples that underwent premarital education experienced higher levels of satisfaction (post-marriage) as well as a 30 per cent decline in the likelihood of divorce over five years. You will thereby build your new life on a more solid foundation, once you have understood each other better. And pre-marital counselling is the key that helps you achieve just that. While you might approach with caution for fear that these sessions may unearth problems you aren't facing with your partner, finding out about them and resolving them before they fester and become major deal-breakers will help you ensure a happy marriage.

Here are some things that you might discuss during pre-marital counselling sessions.

#### MARRIAGE EXPECTATIONS

You may have some ideas and notions about what a marriage will be – or should be. You will have a basic blueprint in mind of how your marriage to your fiancé will look like. But what we sometimes don't realise is that he will also have some ideas and beliefs of his own. Men might not be too vocal about their idea of marriage, but that doesn't mean they don't have any expectations. Discussing these before your marriage will help you both come to a happy middle ground with respect to marriage expectations.

#### **ROLE BELIEFS**

What would the hubby-to-be expect you to do when it comes to housework, or even professionally? What will you be expecting of him? Would he want you to cook regularly? Would you be looking to him to do work around the house too? Would both of you look at hiring help if both work? Generally, in Indian families, the in-laws come into the picture too when it comes to such questions. You need to be very clear on where you stand on such points. Having the right ideas of marriage will help the two of you achieve success in your own.

#### A PRE-MARITAL COUNSELLING SESSION WITH A COUNSELLOR WILL HELP YOU UNDERSTAND EACH OTHER BETTER.

#### MONEY MATTERS

How do you plan to contribute to home expenses? Do you plan for him to give 50 per cent while you put in the remaining half? Do you agree on the percentage based on both your respective incomes? Or are you going to divide the different expenses and take care of specific ones only? You need to understand what each expects of the other, and find out the best possible way to move forward. Another monetary area that you need to speak about is your expenditure and saving styles. Are you looking to invest together? Or do you plan to continue investing individually post-marriage too? Speak to one another about such topics. As you will be living together, you need to ensure your ways don't put undue stress on the other, and find a way that serves both of you well.

#### SEX AND INTIMACY

Not all people have had comprehensive sex education in India, with the taboo about speaking about this looming heavily in more households than one would care to admit. So, it could be possible that either of you have not really spoken about this properly with each other or even understand what all it entails. So, discussing it openly with each other and informing each other about your needs and o

#### PLANS FOR CHILDREN

It isn't just about whether the other person wants children or not, but how many, the time frame for each, the parenting styles, any extended family involvement... This topic will also need to be discussed. For many, the topic of children can be a deal-breaker and to find this out after marriage will create a big problem, obviously. So, discussing this before is always beneficial so neither of you find yourselves at the receiving end of a rude shock.

#### COMMUNICATION AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION

Communication, as you would know, is essential in any meaningful relationship. In a marriage, especially a new one, it becomes even more crucial. You need to understand each other's methods of communication, and find a common and direct channel. Being scared of the other's reaction and not saying what you feel can create problems, as can speaking without realising how it affects the other. Each couple might need to talk about more topics apart from the ones above, and meeting with a counsellor will help you recognise them. There are different types of pre-marital counselling, and opting for the right type can make it more effective and increase the benefits of the experience.

#### In-person counselling

This is where you meet the counselor personally. You meet him or her individually and together to discuss the above topics and more that might arise from the discussion.

### Online pre-marital counselling courses

This is a digital counselling method. It is a fixed course that both of you take together, and it facilitates discussions on various topics like those stated above. It will also advise you on how to anticipate and resolve conflicts that might potentially arise, once married.

DISCUSS HOW YOU WILL COMMUNICATE DURING AND AFTER A CONFLICT.

#### Compatibility tests and questionnaires

These are simple ways of finding out what each of you thinks about different topics, and what the common beliefs you share are, and where there are differences too. These are normally taken alongside pre-marital counselling - whether in-person or online. There isn't a pass or fail in these tests, they just form the basic guide for the discussions ahead.

#### WHAT DOES A PRE-COUNSELLING SESSION ENTAIL?

An in-person counselling might be appropriate for you if you think that you might not be able to discuss and resolve the different issues that could arise in such discussions. If you're opting for this, what is the method the counsellor might use to gather the information required from both of you to be able to help you best? Here are some ways that the counsellor might use... You're asked for background information about yourself and your family. You might have to visit the counsellor individually before heading into a couple's session. You'll have to state the problems you foresee, if any. You might be asked to fill up a compatibility test or questionnaire. You will be asked to discuss any previous relationships and the reasons why they didn't work. Both of you will need to be truthful about all such things, so that the counsellor can get the best results.

#### EACH COUNSELLOR WILL HAVE A UNIQUE WAY OF GETTING THE INFORMATION, BUT THE BASICS REMAIN THE SAME.

Some techniques include providing equal opportunity to both to talk about themselves, and their beliefs, expectations, preconceived notions if any, etc. Open and honest communication is encouraged, and the counsellor knows how to get you to talk about any deep and hidden issues that can create trouble during a marriage if not discussed in time.

Active listening is a skill that doesn't come easy, but is very helpful in a marriage. An active listener is one who fully concentrates, understands, responds and then remembers what is being said. A premarital counsellor will use this technique and also get each of you to do so for better communication.

Each of you would be independently asked to write down your expectations, hopes, and aspirations for married life. With these, the premarriage counsellor can help you with any existing issues as well as identify potential issues that could arise, and ways to resolve them, in the future.

#### THE BENEFITS OF PRE-MARITAL COUNSELLING Positive resolution

A pre-marital counsellor will help guide the conversation regarding the different topics being discussed to reach a proper and beneficial resolution for both. It is easy to get emotional and carried away when discussing topics that you feel very strongly about.

#### Learning conflict-resolving skills

How to solve any problems that might arise during your marriage is a skill both of you need to learn. And if you do have some skills of conflict resolving, then you need to improve them for the best results.

#### Setting realistic expectations

Some of our expectations from the other might not be possible, in a time frame we personally want. So setting realistic goals for realistic expectations is something you'll learn during these sessions.

#### Identifying areas of conflicts in future

While you might not have problems with each other at present, there might be some things you believe or feel that could lead to problems in the future if not recognised and addressed in time. O

Would abortion be acceptable before or after that?

• What philosophies did your parents have with respect to child-rearing and do you agree or disagree with them? How do you intend to shape your children's values?

• Will you have separate or joint checking accounts – or both?

• If you do have different accounts, who will be responsible for which expenses? Who will pay the bills?

• Do the two of you agree to have a full financial disclosure about the personal financial situation at

all times?


our wedding is one of the most special days of your life, and you want everything associated with it to be just so. But, sometimes, in the search of perfection, things can go well over budget and then

we're faced with big issues. So how do you balance getting what you want and staying within the limits of your budget? Here's how...

To begin with, make a list of everything you're going to need for the wedding. We've mapped out a basic one for you to begin with, and you can use this as a rough guide to add or subtract as per your wedding checklist. VENUE – for all functions CATERING – for all functions BRIDAL TROUSSEAU – ensembles for each function, plus jewellery, etc HAIR AND MAKEUP (HMU) – for the bride, mother, sisters, bridesmaids, etc DÉCOR – flowers, lights, etc MUSIC/ENTERTAINMENT – DJ, speakers, live bands etc PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY TRANSPORTATION AND ACCOMMODATION FAVOURS AND GIFTS STATIONERY – save the dates, invitation cards, thank you notes, etc



BALANCE YOUR BUDGET SO THAT YOU CAN STILL GET WHAT YOU WANT WITHOUT GOING CRAZY.





Once you have a full list in place, prioritise the things that are a must. That could be a dream venue (pandemic permitting), the ideal D-Day ensemble, etc. Put the list in order of priority. If you have specifics in any of the other categories and know the costs of the same, note that down too. Once you list out – priority-wise – all items, keep the next column for the cost. Use the Auto sum feature to make note of the total cost.

Know where you can save and what can be 'compromised' on (e-invites instead of physical ones), to ensure that you can get that ensemble-ofyour-dreams for the day of your wedding, or book the perfect venue. Here's a rough break-up of how much you may have to spend for each part of the wedding:

VENUE AND CATERING 40%. (Book as early as possible to get better rates!) BRIDAL TROUSSEAU AND HMU around 20% (Book the HMU artist asap to get a good deal) DÉCOR 15% PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY 10% MUSIC/ENTERTAINMENT 5% FAVOURS, GIFTS, STATIONERY 5% TRANSPORTATION AND ACCOMMODATION 5%

These aren't fixed percentages for the budget, but can give you a rough idea on what you can expect. We all have close family and friends who are going to give you gifts, even after mentioning a no-gift policy. If they are close enough to you, have them get you some of the small things on your wedding list. For example, those pretty earrings that would go perfectly with your sangeet outfit can be a gift from one of your aunts, or that pretty kurta you want for the haldi ceremony can be a gift from a friend. There's no shame in getting friends and family to help out; they'll feel happy that their gifts are a part of your special occasion. •



hifting bases is always a task, and, when you have to do the packing and planning alongside the wedding planning, it can be extremely daunting. Worried about how're you going to manage it? We have your back, fear not! We have put together a to-do list for you that will help you plan, pack and be ready for the move post-wedding. Just keep this handy and tick off the tasks as you go.

#### LIST IT OUT

You need to figure out what you want and don't want. Over the years, we end up collecting – and hoarding – things that we may or may not use.

# PREZZIE TIMES TWO

When you get multiple wedding <u>gifts</u> of the same kind, what do you do? Revamp them into different pieces, of course. Here's how! By **Radhika Sathe-Patwardhan** 

eddings are a time you end up getting a lot of gifts – despite having mentioned "blessings only" in the invitation card. And to top that, you might have end up with multiple gifts of the same kind. Some gifts, like bedsheets and bedcovers, etc are something you can keep in the cupboard and use as and when you need them. But there are some, like utensils, appliances, décor items, etc, that you might not want to use if they're many in number. So what can you do in such cases? You could re-gift them, donate them to NGOs or revamp them into things you need. While the former two may not need much elaboration, here are tips for the latter...

#### GETTING MUGGED

You might have received multiple cup or mug sets. Keep the ones you like and use the others to make something different, like mini-vases, pen stands, etc. You can use a spray paint colour of your choice (or multiple colours) and cover the ones you want to revamp. Embellish them to your heart's content. You could use faux stones, glitter, beads, lace, 3D paint, acrylic paint, etc. to personalise these. If you don't want it to have the handle, take a wide chisel and place it over the handle and use a hammer





with force upon it. This will break off the handle. Do this to the bottom of the handle too if that hasn't come off. Use strong sandpaper to smoothen the remaining edges as much as possible. Once done, use masking tape to wrap all around the mug to smoothen the surface. You may have to wrap it around a couple of times. Cover the mug from top to bottom. And then paint or embellish it as you want.

#### PLATE IT UP

Similar to a cup set, you might get many dinner sets. Keep the ones you want and an extra set for the times you have guests over, and revamp the others. You can make nice décor pieces from them. Spray paint them and use them as frames. Stick a photo in the centre and hang it up. Keep a plate as a centrepiece and arrange the decorative rocks and candles artfully in it. Be inspired by the Japanese pottery repair art, Kintsugi, and make décor pieces by breaking and reattaching the plates. Carefully break the plate by throwing it onto the table from a foot or two feet distance so that it breaks in one or two cracks only. Use a strong adhesive mixed with gold paint to reattach the plate together. Paint with gold paint along the break line too to highlight the gold.

#### **GETTING FRAMED!**

Photo frames are also another thing you might get in abundance. If so, then use as many as you can around the house to frame your most treasured celluloid moments, and revamp the others to make them into something else. You can make one into a centrepiece by replacing the glass with a solid

plastic or metal piece and then placing different items like candles, potted plants, decorative stones, etc. depending on the size. Or make it into a pin-board to stick up important bills or notes for. Measure the frame and draw it out on a piece of sturdy thermocol. Cut out the piece and stick it behind the photo frame after removing the glass. This way the thermcol is directly seen from the frame. You can spray-paint the frame and the thermocol separately and together and voilà! •


