

Letter from the Editor


Binge beginnings

I have been a part of award functions ever since I joined *Filmfare*, when the ice age was just about thawing. And let me tell you no award ceremony has given me the most amount of anxiety prior to it and the least amount of heartache on the day itself than our recently held FLYX Filmfare OTT Awards 2020. It was the worst of the times and then it became the best of the times. I was so relaxed I even took a selfie backstage with my tireless elves from On-Cue, something that I never do. They are the backstage and stagecraft gals who for years have been making sure the shows run like clockwork. The anxiety got mass produced because it was a new property that was being organised when the threat of the pandemic was very much in the air. We had to assemble it in batches and were practically at the venue for close to 15 hours. And let me tell you that after that much time, your *bandhgala* starts feeling like a corset.

This new property was aimed at awarding excellence in the OTT space. Thanks to its ease of accessibility, OTT has become the preferred entertainment venue of the masses. The COVID-19 crisis and subsequent lockdown further increased the numbers on OTT. The pandemic has resulted in making me a glutton for the long-form content. I can personally vouch for the fact that shows like *Paatal Lok, Panchayat, The Family Man, Special OPS, Aarya* et al were lip-smackingly good. And the best part is that unlike in our films, where the winning formula is often repeated, the content here was as diverse as the cheese platter on a Sunday brunch. *Paatal Lok* was a police procedural, *Panchayat* was a situational comedy, *Aarya* was a crime drama, while *Special OPS* was an actioner. The production values of most were akin to those of big-budget films and so was the cinematography, writing, editing and direction.

Our films are ruled by a star system. And stars often have to cater to a certain image. Hence, their performances become increasingly formulaic. On OTT, that's not the case. Here, the emphasis is on creating a version of reality which is as close to the real thing as possible. Our performers, like Manoj Bajpayee, Amit Sadh, Nawazuddin Siddiqui, Kay Kay Menon, took to it like fish to water and blew everyone by their performances. Stars like Priyamani, Nithya Menen and Abhishek Bachchan too benefited from working in a no-strings-attached environment. We hear Shahid Kapoor and Akshay Kumar too are coming up with OTT ventures. Let's see what happens.

My personal man-crush that evening was Jaideep Ahlawat, the leading man of *Paatal Lok*. He's the real outsider who struggled anonymously for years before striking it rich with this series. His is the kind of success story that makes others dream big. May his tribe increase. The present issue is dedicated to the FLYX Filmfare OTT Awards. While some producers sought relief by releasing their films over the OTT platforms, others decided to wait for conditions to improve. Daily wage earners among the film workers were the most affected. Stars like Salman Khan reached out by depositing money directly into the accounts of the needy, Amitabh Bachchan, Shah Rukh Khan, Akshay Kumar, Ajay Devgn, Hritihik Roshan, Varun Dhawan, and every actor worthy of his/her name, came forward to help out in this time of crises. While every one chipped in, Sonu Sood appeared as the symbol of hope for the thousands of migrant workers forced to flee the cities. He helped arrange transport for them and has been helping the needy ever since. Besides the human tragedy that unfolded this year, we also lost several of our gems like Rishi Kapoor, Irrfan Khan, Saroj Khan, Wajid Khan, Jagdeep, Nishikanth Kamanth, Bhanu Athaiya, SP Balasubrahmanyam, Soumitra Chatterjee and Sushant Singh Rajput, Sushant's death by suicide created a social media storm that refused to die down. The investigation of his unnatural death led to the CBI, the ED and the NCB getting involved and numerous industry folks being hauled in for questioning, It wasn't all gloomy though, Kareena Kapoor Khan and Anushka Sharma announced their pregnancies. And the social media thankfully basked vicariously in the afterglow of their maternity. Taking a look at the stars who rocked the headlines in 2020.

SUSHANT SINGH RAJPUT

His fans couldn't digest the fact that he did himself in and started a witch hunt for 'culprits' whom they thought 'killed' Sushant. Their rage made them target everyone from Karan Johar, star kids to even the poor food delivery guy. Friends and family insisted Sushant Singh Rajput just wasn't the sort of person who'd kill himself and cried themselves hoarse shouting murder most foul, never mind that the initial police and the subsequent CBI enquiry, as well as the AIIMS report clearly stated it was an act of suicide and nothing else. #JusticeforSushant trended as widely as a bushfire and stoked flames of hatred for Bollywood. People swore off Hindi films, decided to boycott films starring 'nepokids' -- which resulted in Sadak 2 becoming the most disliked film ever. What's more, the worldwide hue and cry even brought the CBI into the fray as even Bihar CM Nitish Kumar wanted a probe. A whole new can of worms was opened when accusations of havala, drug running and what not started flying fast and thick. It became a hugely politicised mess which is yet to get unentangled.





Chocolate hero Rishi Kapoor was without a doubt one of the most iconic stars to ever grace the silver screen. He made his debut with the mega-hit Bobby (1973) and starred in many commercial hits like Khel Khel Mein (1975), Rafoo Chakkar (1975), Karz (1980) and many more. He won the Filmfare Critics' Best Actor Award for his performance as a middle-aged father yearning to buy his own car in Do Dooni Chaar (2011) and won a Filmfare Best Supporting Actor trophy for his role in Kapoor And Sons (2016) as well. He was bestowed with the Filmfare Lifetime Achievement Award in 2008. He was diagnosed with cancer in 2018. He was on the road to recovery and there were talks that he might even do a film together with his son Ranbir but it was not to be. He passed away on April 30. Even though he isn't between us anymore, we're sure his legacy will live on forever. Jeena yahan, marna yahan...

RHEA CHAKROBARTHY

Rhea had the misfortune of being Sushant's girlfriend at the time of his suicide. People pounced on her like she was the culprit behind it, despite the fact that she'd left his place days before the incident. In people's mind, the lovers' tiff became an act of betrayal. Sushant's family reportedly accused her of everything from mind control, misappropriation of Sushant's money and also his murder. She became the most hated figure on social media. She was a scarlet woman who was literally hunted down with a vengeance. It was even alleged that she was Sushant's drug supplier and made him depended on drugs. On July 30, the actress was called in by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) after a money laundering case was filed by Sushant's father KK Singh against her in Patna. Eventually, Rhea was arrested for being linked with a drug syndicate. The NCB continued with their investigation on the matter and Rhea was granted bail on October 7, 28 days after her arrest. Her brother Showik Chakraborty got bail in December, three months after he was taken in for questioning. After her release, Rhea's lawyer Satish Maneshinde stated that the actress would file cases against those who'd made defamatory statements about her and her family without any substantial proof. Her media trial really was an eyeopener as to how feral our society has become nowadays.



SONU SOOD

Most of us vented our anger on social media after seeing the images of thousands of migrant workers walking from metros like Mumbai and Delhi to their homes in faraway places. Sonu Sood however turned his anger into something productive. He started arranging buses to get the migrants home. Later, using his goodwill, he arranged for interstate travel for anyone who called him and even arranged for flights for the needy. He's said to have helped thousands. It's said he mortgaged two shops and six flats to raise a loan of 10 crores for this humanitarian act. A grateful public responded by naming their shops,





Metro (2007), Paan Singh Tomar (2011), The Lunchbox (2013), Haider (2014), Gunday (2014), Piku (2015) and Talvar (2015). His Hindi Medium (2017) became a sleeper hit in both India and China. A sequel to Hindi Medium called Angrezi Medium (2020) was released on March 13. Irrfan also acted in many acclaimed international films like The Namesake (2006), The Darjeeling Limited (2007), the Academy Award-winning film Slumdog Millionaire (2008), New York, I Love You (2009), The Amazing Spider-Man (2012), Life of Pi (2012), Jurassic World (2015) and Inferno (2016). He passed away on April 29.



ALIA BHATT AND MAHESH BHATT

Mahesh Bhatt was seen as the villain of the piece in the Sushant and Rhea Chakraborty love story as it was he who'd allegedly advised her to move away from a toxic relationship. He was mightily trolled for his support for Rhea. His daughter Alia Bhatt, who'd once said on a chat show, 'Sushant who?' too faced the ire of the troll army when this clip resurfaced. She was branded as a nepokid and suffered a huge loss of followers online. The Mahesh Bhatt directed Sadak 2, where Alia was playing a prominent role, too got caught in the crossfire. Its trailer became the most disliked trailer on YouTube in no time and the film, when released, made history by pulling in the lowest rating on IMDB. People were even miffed over the fact that Alia was using her phone during Rishi Kapoor's funeral, never mind the fact that she was live-streaming the proceedings to Ranbir Kapoor's sister Riddhima, who couldn't fly down from Delhi, because of COVID-19 restrictions.

Kumkum's claim to fame was Guru Dutt's Aar Paar (1954). She is best known for her roles in Mother India (1957), Ujala (1959), Kohinoor (1960), Son Of India (1962), Mr X In Bombay (1964), Aankhen (1968), Geet (1970) Lalkaar (1972), and Ek Kunwari Ek Kunwara (1973) and Bhojpuri film Ganga Maiya Tohe Piyari Chadhaibo (1963). The actor found himself facing another roadblock in life when he was diagnosed with stage four lung cancer on August 11. Ever since the lockdown was imposed in March, Dutt had been living alone in his Mumbai home, his wife Maanvata and children Shahraan and Igra were away in Dubai. However, upon learning about her husband's condition, Maanyata immediately took a flight home to be by his side. The actor underwent multiple rounds of chemotherapy and finally on October 21 announced that he'd emerged victorious in his battle against cancer, proving once again that he's a true fighter and not one to back down when things look bleak.



KANGANA RANAUT

Hell hath no fury like a woman scorned. For some reason. Kangana feels she's been scorned by her colleagues in general and the society in particular. As a result, she comes out all guns blazing at the slightest provocation. Sushant's death proved to be one such outlet for her and she took it upon herself to be an avenging angel for the late actor. Playing the outsider card, she blamed his death on the insider gang in Bollywood. She claimed that a certain section of the film industry ganged up against Sushant and was directly responsible for his mental deterioration. This led to a war of words with different personalities on social media. Then she took on the Maharashtra government, saying she felt like she was living in POK rather than Mumbai. That led to a bout of angry words between her and MP Sanjay Raut. Kangana further hit the headlines, when her office was demolished by the BMC. She claimed she was a victim of a political conspiracy. Last heard, the Mumbai High Court had ordered the civic body to pay her compensation. Her allegedly offensive comments against the Farmers' agitation led to another verbal spat with Diljit Dosanjh, where the Punjabi actor chastised her in pure Punjabi. 
SP BALASUBRAHMANYAN

SPB made his debut as a playback singer with the Telugu film *Sri Sri Sri Maryada Ramanna* in 1966 and slowly established himself as the numero uno playback singer down South. To have the entry song sung by Balu, as he was affectionately known, soon became a tradition in Rajinikanth films. He became the voice of Salman Khan after giving playback for the actor in *Maine Pyar Kiya* (1989) and continued to sing for the actor in many films like *Saajan* (1991), *Patthar Ke Phool* (1991), *Hum Aapke Hain Koun..!* (1994), *Andaz Apna Apna* and many more. Saroj Khan, who passed away on July 3, was the first female choreographer of the film industry and can be said to have created some of the most iconic Bollywood dance moves ever. Saroj was best known for her Sridevi and Madhuri numbers and has some eight Filmfare Awards as the Best Choreographer to her credit, a record of sorts. She won them for Tezaab (1988), Chalbaaz (1989), Sailaab (1990), Beta (1992), Khal-Nayak (1993), Hum Dil De Chuke Sanam (1999), Devdas (2002) and Guru (2007).



TAAPSEE PANNU

Taapsee Pannu proved yet again why she's one of the best in the business with her last release Thappad. The hard-hitting drama accurately showcased how domestic violence is treated as a nonissue in our country and why it's high time that it comes to a stop. Her bikini photos from her Maldives vacation too created a mini tsunami on the internet and so was the 'Biggini' video she shot with her sisters and boyfriend Mathias Boe. Her transformation into an athlete for her forthcoming film Rashmi Rocket too got her raves from her fans.

KAREENA KAPOOR KHAN AND ANUSHKA SHARMA

He's just released his third book, Your Best Day Is Today, which has been well received. In our interview, he calls himself a student of cinema, of life, and says life can surprise you any minute. Excerpts from a straight-from-the-heart interview...



You've written your third book Your Best Day Is Today. What is the similarity between acting and writing a book?

There is no similarity. But I use my observation of life in both — when I am playing a

character and when I am writing a book. By nature, I am not an author. I just felt 10-12 vears back that I have something to share because of whatever I went through or whatever I learnt from life, I just felt that I should express myself. None of my books are based on borrowed emotions or borrowed experiences, they are an extension of what I went

I don't craft my writing, I write by speaking into a dictaphone. I write my thoughts as they come and that can happen anytime. Usually, the title comes first. But for my third book, Your Best Day Is Today, the title came in the end. I was recently seeing a meme about Wolves Of Wall Street where Leonardo Di Caprio's character says that "you want me for 30 minutes.

I have watched Kuch Bhi Ho Sakta Hai a couple of times and the audience reacted differently every time I saw it. Does that impact your performance in any way? Oh yes, every

through. My books are also my observation of my own self, the world and the people around me. When you are acting it out, it's your interpretation of one character. But when you're reading a book, it's the reader's interpretation of what you've written.

Does writing come easily to you?

but that also includes those 20 years that I have put in those 30 minutes". When I write, I also bring the experience of those 50-60 years that I've tried to understand life. I have wonderful publishers in Hay House publishing and my friend who's managing the Hay House in India, Ashok Chopra. He gives a shape to my books.

How easy is it to put in some of the uncomfortable parts of your life in an autobiography? Before writing my autobiography, I put it up on stage. Kuch

autobiography, I put it up on stage. *Kuch Bhi Ho Sakta Hai* is my autobiography on stage. I wrote about whatever went wrong in my life, whatever my failures were and I laughed at them and that act itself liberated me. When

I was a struggling actor I used to read autobiographies of a lot of people to feel better. And the autobiography of Charlie Chaplin, called MvAutobiography, is the finest and the most inspirational book that I have read. I thought that if he can go through whatever he has gone through in his childhood then in that sense, this is the best path to become somebody. And similarly, when I wrote my autobiography or when I performed it on stage, the

time! The live audience changes your performance. Sometimes when I perform in Tata Theatre the audience is so amazing but if the audience isn't reciprocating, it can fall flat. I remember I was on a tour in America and we were doing a show in Washington and for some strange reason, the audience for the first 20 minutes did not react to my performance. So I stopped the play halfway through. I said you people have forgotten how

to laugh, so let's do some exercises. A play like Kuch Bhi Ho Sakta Hai depends a lot on the audience's reaction because it's a hundred and twenty-seven pages long play and I'm all alone on the stage. I am playing some hundred characters. Sometimes people are completely generous in their reactions but sometimes they are not. Also, when people come to see the play, they are a little shy about laughing out loud. That's why the play starts with me mingling among the audience and relaxing them.

You've talked about depression, not in the book but variously. An actor's life has so many ups and downs. How do you exorcise your demons?

I think writing is cathartic because it's personal. In films, you have other people and you're portraying a character, it validates you. But in writing, it's the thought that comes to your mind, you write it and then you connect with it. Your Best Day Is Today was cathartic because I came back from New York on March 20. When I landed up here in Mumbai, it was a fearful atmosphere.

I thought I was in a Will Smith film called I Am Legend where the whole world had come to an end, and he and his dog were the only survivors. I've never seen Mumbai like that. I've never seen the streets of Mumbai so empty, I've never seen the airport so deserted. I thought about how to find optimism in this dark time. On the third morning,

I discovered that for the first time in my stay in Mumbai, I actually heard the chirping of birds and this was the silver lining. In this pandemic, we realised that we need only certain things in our lives. One is we need to be with our close friends and family. The second thing we need is the essential commodities and third the WiFi should be working so that you're

connected to the world. That's how I started writing this book. We lost Rishi Kapoor, we lost Irrfan, we lost Wajid Khan, and I lost my yoga guru's husband who was a dear friend of mine. I have a picture of 59 students from my 10th grade. I reached out to 38 of them after 50 years. Somebody called Anil Datta, somebody called Manindar Singh, and somebody

called Rajeev Sharma...

You spoke about communication just now, that made me think that you teach acting which is again communication. They say actors are healers, what do you think?

I opened an acting school so that I can remain relevant as an actor. I learn a lot from the students. The problem happens when you carry the burden of being Anupam Kher,

ab toh muihe sab kuch aata hai (now I know everything). That's why I hate words like thespian, legend, veteran because they make you aware of the fact that vou've done a lot of work. because I think I've just reached the interval point. The school can teach you techniques but you have to practice it to become better. That's why actors are like wine, they mature better while performing. I learn a lot from today's generation because their interpretation is so different. We teach them self-worth, we teach them how

to understand life. They change in the three months they spend with us and are completely different from what they were before. We make them meet themselves which is a good thing, as an actor needs to meet himself or herself.

Have you seen an actor falling into a trap of showbiz and stardom and have you ever advised a

youngster about it?

I don't give advice unless I am asked for it. Amrish Puri ii kaha karte the. bol dena chahida bachya nu ki mehsoos karde ho, it's very important. Maine kaha Amrish ji aapki baat alag hai, aap hamesha se Amrish ji ho. (Amrish Puri told me to give advise to youngsters even when they don't ask fot it but I told him

that being a senior he can give advice but I can't). I am contemporary to all these young actors. Satish Kaushik told me one incident about Rajesh Khanna. Satish was in a hurry to go somewhere and the producer told him he'd take his shots first. Satish went on the sets and saw Raiesh Khanna waiting. Satish was horrified to know that Rajesh Khanna was made to wait because of him. He immediately said he'd wait the whole night if need be but Khanna saab's shots should be taken first. The point is that success is very momentary. If you can grow as a person then you can deal with it. I am not the most happening person in the world today but I can hold a conversation on any topic. How many actors can write a book about life? How many actors can communicate with people who have nothing to do with acting? How many actors can be motivational speakers and talk about the power of failure at Harvard or Oxford? Dilip Kumar had 55 years of stardom because times were different. Amitabh Bachchan had 45 vears of stardom. Shah Rukh Khan,

Aamir Khan, Salman Khan, Akshav Kumar all have 20-35 years of stardom. Today's stars will only be known by their last film. There are so many ways of entertainment today. There are malls, eating places, multiplexes, phone, there are millions of channels... So you have to be brilliant all the time, you have to be a trained actor and vou have to be a fighter as a person...

You have worked in blockbusters, in the middle-of-the-road cinema, you've gone to Hollywood and now there's this

OTT craze. Have you changed as an actor or is the medium the only change?

If you're good on stage, you're good on television. you're good on OTT. Platforms have nothing to do with the acting or even with your capabilities. Today, an actor is at the mercy of the remote as there is so much choice. People's memory is very short in today's time. You have to keep yourself relevant. That's why Yash Chopra was great because Yash ji kept his relevance alive. He kept changing with the times.

What would have a happening 65-year-old guy tell a happening 30-year-old guy? (Laughs) Kuch Bhi Ho Sakta Hai.

If you could elaborate...

Keep the sense of wonder alive in you as a person and as an actor, more as a person. When we become authorities, either in life or in acting... that's the beginning of the end. In the last 36 years, I have not taken myself seriously. When you want to be somebody else that's why you pretend, if you like yourself you will not pretend. Tell your problems to people, tell your shortcomings to people. Don't hide them, because that's what people manipulate with. In

2002-2003 I almost went bankrupt, I tell this freely. Ab aap mujhe kis baat se daraoge (now how will you scare me). So keep it simple and don't start believing that vou're God. Bada acha ek sher hai ki "Woh jo ek shaks tujhse pehle yahan takhtnashi tha, use bhi apne khuda hone ka itna hi yakeen tha" (The gentleman before you, he too believed he was God). Enjoy the journey. The destination is not important. The journey is important. And a journey which does not have hurdles, speed breakers, accidents, isn't worth talking about. When we sit with our friends, our childhood friends. our teenage friends, we only talk about

disasters, about what went wrong. We don't talk about success stories. Success stories are boring and they are repetitive. It's the failure stories which have amazing juice.

That's true

Look at all the love stories. Whether it's Shirin-Farhad. whether it's Romeo-Juliet, whether it's Marilyn Monroe or James Dean. We romanticise them. You have to love every moment of your journey. And this is what Your Best Day Is Today is about. This moment is important. You and me, we don't speak to each other but there was a bond that we created when you met me at my Veera Desai office all those years ago and we have kept that warmth alive. I always say that there are certain relationships which are like the pause button on the tape recorder, you start from where you left off...




