Letter from the Editor

OTT Awards and all that

The MyGlamm Filmfare OTT Awards 2021 have ended. It felt surreal to conduct a show in the times of COVID-19. OTT has emerged as the safety valve for all. People are in awe of its reach but methinks it's the content which is responsible for its success. I belong to an era where the success of a film was gauged by its performance on the first day, first show. The masses have an uncanny feel for what works and what doesn't and just like in that era, word-of-mouth works big in this era as well. *This Is Us* or *Emily In Paris*, to cite two obvious examples, have been buzzing since the day they were first telecast. And the conviction with which she essayed her difficult role gave you goosebumps.

For Kani Kusruti, hailing from hardcore Malayalam films and finding a pan-Indian audience, thanks to *Ok Computer*, for Sharib Hashmi, who was bouncing like a bunny on energy drink, for Sunita Rajwar, who beamed like moonlight, for Geetanjali Kulkarni and Amruta Subhash who are finally getting their due. Watch out for them in years to come. For Nawazuddin Siddiqui, who is reportedly unhappy with OTT because of its commercialisation but shouldn't quit as he's one of its leading lights. For Hansal Mehta, who has seen some major personal upheavals but has never let anything deter him, and of course for Pratik Gandhi, the unknown who became an overnight OTT superstar, thanks to *Scam 1992: The Harshad Mehta Story...*The current issue is dedicated to all the winners, as well as the nominees who shone in the OTT space and kept us entertained in 2021. inter is here. And so is the Omicron variant. Which seems to be sparing no one. Even yours truly has succumbed to the virus. We've all seen and heard stories of the horrors the Delta variant had bestowed upon the world. Thankfully, Omicron hasn't been that horrible but the spike in the growth rate of those affected has been alarming. The film industry, in particular, again seems to be the worst hit. Kareena Kapoor Khan, John Abraham, Mrunal Thakur, Nora Fatehi, Ekta Kapoor, Madhur Bhandarkar, Arijit Singh...the virus has hit a wide spectrum.

The film business

has been hit yet again. Theatres have either been shut in most states or have been told to follow the 50 per cent occupancy rule. The masses as such don't seem to be keen on going to the theatres under such circumstances. A wellmade film like 83 was barely able to cross 100 crores because of these reasons. Sooryavanshi, which was released in November 2021, just before the Omicron hit, was able to reach around 200 crores. The only movie which didn't get affected by the vius was the pan-India hit Pushpa. The Allu Arjun starrer garnered 325 crores worldwide and its Hindi dubbed version garnered around 84 crores at the time of writing. It's said that producers are

again going to take the OTT route to make good their losses, as the rise in the positive cases shows no sign of decline.

All this doesn't augur well for the industry in the short run. But as Hollywood shows, we're in for a long fight and that doesn't mean giving in. They haven't scaled down on production values. On the contrary, films have become bigger, more spectacular. The rise of platforms has been phenomenal. Most of the big movies either stream directly online or are available iust a few weeks later. The success of movies like Red Notice, which starred Dwayne Johnson, Gal Gadot and Ryan Revnolds has shown that star power is here to stay. Buoved by its success, the streaming giant Netflix has announced two back-to-back sequel for it, turning it into a franchise in the process. Our big producers too have been taking stock of the situation. Like YRF announced this big period drama, The Railway Men. Starring R Madhavan, Kay Kay Menon, Babil Khan and others, the series will look into the rescue operations which took place after the Bhopal gas tragedy. Other big studios are expected to announce ambitious projects as well.

So, happy new year everyone. Prepare for the worst, hope for the best. And mask up.
